Our Pupil Premium Allocation for 2015-16 was £15,400.

Closing the Gap strategy	Impact
Additional teacher to work in Key Stage 1	Disadvantaged pupils in Y1 achieved more highly than non-disadvantaged in Reading, Writing and Maths. 100% disadvantaged pupils in school met end of year expectations in maths. 91% disadvantaged pupils met end of year expectations in reading and writing.
Music lessons	There was a significant difference in pupil concentration. This led to reading results being significantly higher than non-disadvantaged pupils in the same year group.
Marking Pupil premium books first	All disadvantaged pupils in school met end of year expectations in maths. 91% disadvantaged pupils met end of year expectations in reading and writing.
ATA time in KS2 devoted to in-class support for Pupil Premium children, including support during feedback, recapping at the end of sessions and throughout lessons	100% disadvantaged pupils in KS2 school met end of year expectations in reading, writing and maths.
ATA support for interventions in comprehension, grammar and maths at KS2	100% disadvantaged pupils in KS2 met the expected standard in reading, writing and maths for the end of KS2.
ATA led pre-teaching groups at KS2	100% disadvantaged pupils in KS2 met end of year expectations in reading, writing and maths.
Resources to support children Adopted from Care	Sensory boxes offer children the opportunity to self-regulate. This is vital for some of our children and means that they can access learning. This impacts on achievement.
Extra Curricular Activities/ After School Clubs	Increase in pupil confidence and self-esteem due to sport and drama clubs where they have the opportunity to shine. This impacts on achievement.
Fund school trips and visits	All visits are accessed by all pupils. No trip has to be cancelled because of the cost to school. This means that the curriculum is broad and balanced and pupils are inspired to learn. This impacts on achievement.
1:1 ATA Support during After School clubs	This ensures access to clubs for children who need support. It is vital that all children feel included in all aspects of school life. This impacts on achievement.
